Overview: The purpose of the Marilyn Bagwell Leadership Development Grant Program is to provide funds for:

- For school clubs wishing to create an official NSNA chapter (for information about starting a chapter, refer to *Getting the Pieces to Fit* available on www.nсна.org under “publications”). Schools that do not have an official chapter may use the funds to send students to state and national meetings and conventions so that they can learn about the association and how to start an official chapter.
- Official NSNA chapters to support student participation in state and national NSNA meetings or conventions.

The total grant award of \$1,000.00 is given to one nursing program annually. The school that receives the grant is recognized at the NSNA Annual Convention during the Opening Ceremony. The convention takes place in Orlando, Florida at Disney’s Coronado Springs Resort ®. The Opening Ceremony is on Wednesday evening, April 7, 2010.

A faculty advisor from the nursing program must apply for the grant (individuals are not eligible to apply);

- The student organization or club must have a faculty advisor;
- Student(s) who are supported by the grant to attend conventions and meetings must be matriculated in the nursing program and be NSNA members;
- **The deadline for receipt of application is Friday, February 12, 2010.**

Guidelines for Grant Request

1. Funds are to be used by May 31, 2011.
2. Grant awards will be made in the name of school and not to an individual.
3. Funds may be used to support involvement of nursing students in state or national NSNA meetings or conventions or to establish an NSNA chapter.
4. A report on the outcome of the grant must be issued to the FNSNA by July 31, 2011.
5. Please submit 4 copies of the application, proposal and all attachments.
6. Funds may NOT be used to fund faculty to state or national NSNA meetings or conventions.
7. The faculty advisor of the nursing program must apply for this grant. Individual students may not apply. For more information please contact:
